The Analog Revival in a Digital World

Here's where things get controversial. Purists argue that solid-state power amps sacrifice musicality for measurements. Wait, no - scratch that. The real breakthrough came when Cambridge Audio's CXA81 amplifier incorporated feed-forward error correction.
